
- ... Stay in touch with loved ones

- •Fast reliable information regarding

 - Leave extensions




- ... Access emergency financial assistance

- Referrals to military and other health and support services






What you should do if you or a loved one are on active duty or are called into active service:

- Know how to contact the nearest American Red Cross office
- Have appropriate military ID card
- Have appropriate information about the service member, including a copy of the service members activation orders and travel itinerary
- •Obtain limited power of attorney




What you should do (cont.)

- Have pre-authorization to obtain emergency financial assistance (Navy/Marine Corps only)
- Create an alternative child (elder) care plan
- Obtain a medical treatment consent form
- •Emergency plan for pets




Other helpful tips:

- Make sure you have an updated will
- Discuss family financial matters-what and when bills are due, where receipts are kept, budgets, etc
- Get to know your neighbors, they can be a great support to the family
- If there are marital problems, seek counseling before departing.




Around the House:

- Extra sets of keys
- List of repair persons to call
- Location of utility (electric/gas/water) shut-offs
- Share instructions on how to perform chores



Communications:

- Pre-addressed, stamped post cards/pens
- Email addresses






